GGDI projects and developments cross the entire county and involve almost all economic sectors, with a focus on those projects which are of base economic significance. If you have an idea or know of a project opportunity, please contact GGDI. Since 1978, GGDI has assisted in 271 projects resulting in \$65.8 million in additional tax revenue and the creation of 2,391 net jobs.

GGDI has assisted in the procurement of **\$10.8 million** in grant dollars for various projects resulting in direct benefits and/or savings to Gratiot citizens.

GGDI administers the **Brownfield Program**, which has led to the redevelopment of several environmentally-challenged sites, 455 net jobs, and \$25 million in new investment. GGDI works with a number of **local**, **regional**, and **state** partners in order to successfully complete business & community projects.

Established: Shiloh Industries purchased Contech Castings in 2013 Shiloh Industries is a leading provider of high-pressure aluminum die cast parts for the automotive industry.

2015 Project: \$16.5 million expansion to include plant redevelopment, upgrades to existing equipment, and purchase of new machinery & equipment



Shiloh products are used in various cars and light trucks, including the Silverado, Sierra, Corvette, Yukon, Encore, Traxx, Dodge Journey, Nissan Frontier, and other foreign cars.



Shiloh-Alma employees average 14 years of service!

This expansion was necessary due to a project order Shiloh received. The project entails designing and installing a manufacturing system for a cast and machined aluminum planetary carrier that will be used in GM's new 9-speed transmission. This new part will go into nearly all of GM's front wheel drive vehicles. Shiloh-Alma produces aluminum die castings for the automotive industry, with a focus on the steering and powertrain market segments. Approximately 4 million parts are shipped out annually to customers all around the world, including South Korea and China.



Shiloh's expansion is expected to create 45 jobs. The Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) awarded \$1 million in Community Development Block Grant funds to Shiloh for job training activities including employee onboarding, new equipment/tooling training, and necessary technical training to operate and maintain the new equipment. 

#### **Garr Tool Company**

(Pine River Twp., MI; FTE: 141; www.garrtool.com) Garr Tool produces 14,000 carbide cutting tools DAILY! 600-700 boxes per day are shipped across North America and to 20 distributors that serve 40 countries worldwide! The company is expanding in 2016 and will have a 200,000 sq. ft. facility.







#### Apex Marine, Inc. (St. Louis, MI; FTE: 89; www.apexmarineinc.com)

Apex builds over 150 different models of compact and electric pontoon boats. Annually, they produce over 2,000 boats for distribution to dealers across North America. Apex has a plant expansion planned for 2016. Aircraft Precision Products, Inc. (APPI) (Ithaca, MI; FTE: 65 and counting; www.aircraftprecision.net)

APPI, an employee-owned company, just completed a recent expansion. APPI produces jet engine parts that are sold across North America and internationally to 5 different countries.

# Growing Gratiot: Farm to Table Agriculture

71% of land in Gratiot County is dedicated to harvested cropland, resulting in unique opportunities for consumers to buy a bountiful variety of crops from local farms. Not only is it reassuring to know where your food is coming from, but it also boosts the local economy. The Farmers Market Coalition reported that growers selling locally create 13 full-time farm operator jobs per \$1 million in revenue earned. For information on where to purchase Gratiot-produced agricultural products, check out the details below.



Farmers markets offer fresh produce, delicious baked goods, & unique craft items. Markets are held weekly in Alma, Ithaca, and Breckenridge; for dates and times, visit the city websites. Some vendors at the Alma and Ithaca Farmers Markets accept WIC Project Fresh (for women & children) and Market Fresh (for senior citizens) coupons, giving nutritionally-at-risk consumers access to fresh produce. Gratiot County has a number of local and regional CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) programs serving the area. CSAs offer you a chance to purchase a weekly share of a farmer's produce from June to October. In 2014, Alma College received a \$5 million grant from The Herbert H. and Grace A. Dow Foundation to fund a STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) education initiative: "e-STEM: Enhancing STEM Education and Practice." The initiative provides new opportunities for students and faculty at both Alma College and K-12 schools to collaborate and engage in real-world research and learning in the academic disciplines of STEM through the four components mentioned below. Alma has also received over \$1 million in funding for scholarship and research opportunities from the National Science Foundation.

### **Dow Digital Science Center**





The DDSC provides highly advanced research opportunities for the collection and storage of data and remote sensing instrumentation. The grant also provides funding for local high schools to purchase equipment to interface with the DDSC.

### e-STEM Summer Camps





Summer science camps engage K-12 students with age-appropriate science experiences. The camps will feature side-by-side research with Alma College faculty and time to design DDSC projects for K-12 schools.

### Science Olympiad Support

Alma College faculty and Science Olympiad coaches help K-12 students and teachers become more familiar with program rules, the engineering and physics behind events, and how to create awardwinning projects.









Alma College continuously looks for opportunities to work with community, education, and industry leaders to develop STEM projects that address local and regional problems. Projects include assisting with cleanup of the Pine River (left) and learning about different species like Alma, the Snowy Owl (above).

Alma College is a regional partner of the Great Lakes Bay Regional Alliance's STEM Impact Initiative. The initiative unites regional education, industrial, and community leaders with a common mission: "To build the workforce of tomorrow through comprehensive STEM education and training to meet the growing needs of current employers and to attract new jobs and companies to the Great Lakes Bay Region." 
# **Michigan Certified Business Parks**


