TRANSPORTATION

Gratiot County is centrally located in Michigan's lower peninsula, making it an accessible location for any industry. The County is centered along the U.S. Highway 127 north and south corridor. Michigan Highway 46 runs east and west in the northern portion of Gratiot, while Michigan Highway 57 does the same in the southern portion. These main routes allow Gratiot to be accessed from many major highways and interstates. The County is also accessible by rail; Great Lakes Central Railroad, a regional railroad, provides a north-south line through Gratiot, and Mid-Michigan Railroad, a short line railroad, provides an east-west line.
